This year's event, at both A,J's Hangar and Stages Nightclub, raised over \$11,000 cash and enabled us to collect 1,160 items of good quality non-perishable food for the Partners in Mission Food Bank. The cash proceeds were divided 75% to Ryandale House for the Homeless- a parking their rest for the rest of the year - and 25% to the Food Bank, allowing them to purchase perishable dairy products and produce items.

We were also able to bring about the creation of a promotional video for Ryandale House that will assist them in their fund-raising efforts. As well, local hotellers and other parties contributed large donations of household items and tolletties for Ryandale.

Although Ryandale House and the Food Bank still need our support, both can rest a little easier in the coming months, thanks to you!

Having almost doubled last year's results, we feel that our expansion this year to two venues was amply justified. The goal of The Live Music Lovers' Charity Concert Committee, however, is to create a Live Music Lovers' Weekend for Ringston, also including juzz, Polic Country, and Classical music concents. A central focus of the weekend would be The Little Live Music Lovers' Charity Concert (L.* ML.C.2*?), just for kids! Kingston needs a musical festival: a celebration of the wealth of slatent and diversity of styles found in our hometown. Your support of this year's show can only help this dream become a reality.
